RCHF'S Annual Golf Classic Raises \$180,000



The 39th Redlands Community Hospital Foundation's Golf Classic for the Ken Corwin Cup returned this year after COVID-19 forced its cancellation in 2020. Continuing with tradition, Redlands Country Club hosted the event with a limited field size and a scaled down dinner program on June 17, 2021. Although participant numbers were adjusted to accommodate current safety protocols, excitement ran high as always and golfers were thrilled to be on the course again to support Redlands Community Hospital. The day was deemed a great success.

Assemblymember James Ramos and his wife Theresa were selected as the tournament's Honorary Co-Chairs. This year, the RCH Foundation proudly announced, through the commitment from generous sponsors and golfer participation, net proceeds of \$180,000 for its *Fight Against Cancer* initiative and the planned construction of a new on-site cancer center.

"The Golf Classic is always a very special event," said Kathy Meredith, RCH Foundation board chair. "Not only is it great fun for both the golfers and the community, it raises a significant amount of money each year for projects that are important to the hospital and our community."

For nearly four decades, the Golf Classic has been the highest profile and most anticipated fundraiser for Redlands Community Hospital, drawing golfers and sponsors throughout the Inland Empire. Proceeds over the years total \$5,100,000. "We thank James and Terri Ramos, all of our participants and our sponsors for coming together for an afternoon of fun to support RCHF's *Fight Against Cancer* initiative," said Jan Opdyke, RCH Foundation President. "This initiative will allow us to further expand cancer care in the Inland Empire."

Advanced Thermoregulation Promotes Newborn Safety

Thanks to the Redlands Community Hospital Foundation, new Panda Wall-Mount Warmers are on the way to the RCH Labor and Delivery unit. These new warmers will replace outdated models currently in use which were installed when the Maternal/Surgery Tower was built in 2007. Warming units are essential in providing a radiant heating source in order to maintain a newborn's thermal balance - key to keeping them safe.

"Mom is the first source of heat, but if baby needs more intensive care, we use our warmers," says Carolyn Arnold, Director of Maternal Child Services. If a newborn's temperature drops, it may cause complications and create a need for immediate warming procedures. If immediate warming is unavailable, it increases the chances of potential transfer to the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU), decreases health outcomes for the infant, and interferes with family bonding.

Extending her thanks to the RCH Foundation for their support of the hospital's tiniest patients, Arnold gratefully conveys, "We are so fortunate that our Foundation is helping with the purchase of new warming units to keep our babies safe!"

Staxi: Not Your Grandparent's Wheelchair

The Redlands Community Hospital Foundation (RCHF) recently provided funding for new Staxi wheelchairs. The chairs will be used for inpatient and outpatient admissions and discharges. Utilizing funds from donor directed gifts, the foundation approved the purchase this spring.

Providing greater wheelchair inventory and promoting easy accessibility were important factors in the decision to purchase Staxi chairs according to Cherie Towers, Director of Volunteer Services. Maximizing space was also a critical consideration, said Towers as, "these chairs offer organized, compact storage." The chairs nesting capability allows the hospital to double the number of wheelchairs in the current storage space. An area near the hospital's entrance was specifically designed to stow the chairs while not in use. Towers added that keeping the chairs safely out of walkways and high traffic routes, but still readily accessed when needed, is important.



Staxi chairs are more user-friendly than traditional wheelchairs – both for the occupant and the operator. Offering a fail-safe braking system and lifting armrests for easy occupant entry, these chairs are designed for optimal weight distribution which makes them easy to push and maneuver.

The RCH Foundation's funding will provide thirteen standard Staxi wheelchairs and three larger capacity Bariatric chairs.

The Employee Campaign for the Emergency Department Concludes in July 2021

In January 2018, the Redlands Community Hospital Foundation (RCHF) launched the Vital Capital Campaign to help fund the renovation and expansion of the Emergency Department (ED). As part of this effort, the employee portion of the Vital Campaign sprang into action that April, and with the slogan of "Building Our Future," successfully secured combined contributions from RCH staff totaling over \$575,000!

Steering committee members met one-on-one with employees to share the vision for RCH's future of expanded emergency care, and invited each person to join the campaign with a 3-year pledge. Hundreds of staff committed to the Vital campaign and are now nearing the conclusion of their faithful promise.

Like building with Legos, these contributions continue to expand and transform RCH's Emergency Department. To date, these contributions have helped finance the doubling of square footage, increased bed capacity and the addition of specialized treatment areas and advanced technology. The ambitious construction and remodeling project is currently in its fifth and final phase.

To commemorate the generous support of every employee who pledged to the campaign, a naming plaque was unveiled listing each donor's name in the new ED entrance in August 2019. Now, all who enter the doors of the Emergency Department are reminded of the innovative, comprehensive emergency care provided by RCH, in part, through the kind gifts of its employees.

"I can remember when a new Emergency Department was just a dream," says Sue Baze, Campaign Co-Chair. "Now, every time I look at this beautiful new space, it makes me so proud of the people I work alongside who gave so generously to make the dream come true. Together, we've built our future!"

"Feels Like Home"

These are the impassioned words of Carmen Godoy, longtime RCH employee, Environmental Services Tech, and hospital donor. Describing her 25+ year career here, her response is simple: "This is my family."

Godoy began her employment with Redlands Community Hospital in 1995 and quickly settled in, taking great pride in her new position. A bit later, she was unexpectedly sidelined by a non-work injury. At home healing, she missed her RCH coworkers and her regular routine, and worried about her job. Suddenly, a knock at her front door revealed her supervisor arriving for a cheerful visit. To this day, Godoy is still struck by "how caring and supportive" that simple act was.

Years after her recuperation and return to work, Godoy's bicycle - her primary mode of transportation to and from the hospital - was stolen. Crestfallen, the familiar worry about her job returned. Turns out, she needn't have worried; her supervisor arranged to surprise her with a new bike. Says Carmen, "everyone here has always helped me when I needed it."

For many years now, Godoy has been primarily assigned as an EVS Tech in the hospital's Intensive Care Unit (ICU). According to her, "the ICU makes me feel like part of the team because they treat me as family." Ana Campos, ICU Manager, echoes this feeling, "Carmen is an amazing worker and an important member of our team. She is always courteous and helpful to all, keeping our unit running smoothly – especially during the pandemic. Carmen is an unsung hero and definitely part of our family!"

In 2018, the Redlands Community Hospital Foundation launched the Vital Capital Campaign for the Emergency Department expansion and remodel. Cesar Laguna from the RCH Engineering Department was a member of the steering committee, and was instrumental in spreading the word about donating to the employee campaign. "When Carmen learned about the campaign, she was eager to help," says Laguna, "her hard work, generosity and integrity have always been things I admire." Vital employee steering committee members personally invited RCH employees to consider pledging one hour of their base hourly rate each pay period for 3 years to the campaign's cause. Godoy's response when Laguna asked her was swift and straightforward: "What is only one hour every paycheck to help my family?"

Godoy expands on her desire to donate by explaining that it is "an honor" and that her goal of continuing her many years of service to the hospital is her "biggest motivation." Says Godoy, "I always do the best I can because everyone treats me so well here."

Her love for the ICU staff is evident, and their adoration for her is returned in equal measure. In fact, they honored her with their 'TTP' Award for the first quarter of 2021, a special recognition that stands for Total Team Player. According to Ana Campos, Godoy was selected by the staff because "she always and consistently goes beyond her duty."

Indeed she does go beyond, as evidenced by her faithful, continued donations to the Redlands Community Hospital Foundation - in support of her 'family.'
